qualified homeless or low-to-moderate income individuals and families:

◆ Four rental apartments along Del Range

◆ Key Transitional Housing (KTH) :
six-two year residency three single-family homes

◆ Smith Manor: 18 efficiency apartments to assist with transition back to work

◆ Homeless Veteran Housing apartments:
four apartments assisting up to eight homeless veterans
